S.R.O.No...../2014:- In pursuance of the powers conferred under clause (iii) of the proviso to sub-rule (1) of rule 108 and sub rules (2),(3) and (4) thereof of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 and in supersession of the notification No. G.O.(P)No.67/2012/Tran dated 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2012, published as S.R.O. No.792/2012 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No.1190 dated 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2012, the Government of Kerala hereby specify that the vehicles carrying high dignitaries as specified in Schedule I below are permitted to use red light with flasher on the top front of the vehicle while on duty anywhere in the State, that the vehicles carrying the dignitaries specified in Schedule II are permitted to use red light without flasher on the top front of the vehicle while on duty any where in the State, that the vehicles specified in Schedule III are permitted to use blue light with or without flasher and that the vehicles specified in Schedule IV are permitted to use multicoloured red, blue and white light, namely:-

- 4 Speaker of the Kerala Legislative Assembly
- 5 Leader of Opposition of the Kerala Legislative Assembly

- 7 Vice Chairman, Kerala State Planning Board
- 8 Judges of the High court of Kerala

## SCHEDULE IV

Vehicles of operational agencies which require unhindered access to the roads for performance of their duty, those engaged in emergency duties such as ambulance services, fire services, emergency maintenance etc. and police vehicles used for Law and Order duties.

2. Any vehicle carrying the dignitary formally designated as equivalent in rank, status and privileges to those dignitaries referred to in Schedule I and II above shall be entitled to use the red light as per the corresponding privileges.

3. In case the vehicle fitted with red light with or without flasher on top front is not carrying the dignitary then such red light shall not be used and it shall be covered by a black cover if the red light is permanently affixed.

## Explanatory Note

(This does not form part of the notification, but is intended to indicate its general purport)

Rule 108 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 empowers the State Government to specify the high dignitaries for the purpose of the rule and to specify the motor vehicles on which red, blue and multi coloured lights shall be fitted. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the order dated 10/12/2013 in SLP(C) No. 25237/10 directed that the State Government and Administration of Union Territories should amend the relevant rules and notification to bring them in tune with the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 and notifications issued by the Central Government. The Government have decided to specify the high dignitaries in the State in accordance with the above notification and also to specify the vehicles on which red, blue or multicoloured lights shall be used.

The notification is intended to achieve the above purpose.
